MINUTES

The minutes of the December 2nd regular meeting were approved as presented, on motion by Councilman Warren, seconded by Councilman Williams and carried unanimously.

MONTHLY REPORTS

Presented for audit by the Board were:

1. The Supervisor's report of all cash receipts & disbursements for November.
2. The Dog Control Officer's report of all activities for November.
3. The Code Enforcement Officer's report of all building permits issued in December.

BILLS TO BE PAID

Highway bills were approved as audited on motion by Councilman Warren, seconded by Councilman Williams and carried unanimously: **RESOLVED: that Highway vouchers #209 through #224 totaling \$119,116.36 be approved for payment.**

General bills were approved as audited on motion by Councilman Young, seconded by Councilman Williams and carried unanimously: **RESOLVED: that General vouchers #301 through #333 totaling \$21,198.50 be approved for payment.**

NEW BUSINESS

Supervisor Forbes read a thank-you note from Dan Weddle thanking the Board for the appreciation dinner held on December 8th, and stating how he's enjoyed serving on the Town Board for the last 24 years.

Forbes said that the Town Board members and Attorney Snyder would be splitting the cost of the restoration of the Francis B. Carpenter painting just donated to the Town by a Carpenter descendant.

On motion by Councilman Young, seconded by Councilman Williams and carried unanimously:
RESOLVED: that the Town Board supports the New York State Association of Superintendents of Highway's resolution to lobby the State for equal funding for both upstate and downstate roads and bridges (attached).

Councilman Warren discussed the recent inspection of the Town Hall by the Village's fire inspector, Kim Fairchild. Warren said that he is waiting on an estimate for the installation of smoke detectors, and that all other items noted during the inspection have been corrected.

Supervisor Forbes thanked Brian Young for his fifteen years of service on the Board, and Young said that he has been honored to serve the Town.
